Requirements

Communication Studies 60A, 60B, 60C, and 60D are **required** courses. Each is a co-requisite for a Communication Studies 71, 72, 73, or 76 lecture course, respectively. The lab courses enable students to practice selected English phonemes (sounds) from the coursework in the corequisite.

- In the 1st. week of the semester, you must select the time and day you agree to attend the lab.
- 2. You must attend 1 hour per week, for 13 weeks, starting with an orientation/pre-test in the 2nd. week of the semester.
- If the recorded lessons for a module adds to less than 1 hour, use the remaining time to <u>review the same</u> module. If you leave without attending 1 hour, you will not receive attendance credit.
- 4. If you are absent more hours than the number of hours the class meets per week, the instructor may exclude you.
- 5. If your lab session falls on a school holiday, see your lab instructor to reschedule to attend in the <u>same week</u> as the holiday.
- Absences are not automatically excused. If you miss any lab session, you must consult with your lab instructor immediately.
- 7. You must pass a Final Exam.

Technical Information

The course work for the lab is online. See a staff member if you need training in basic computer skills. If necessary, you will be referred to the LACC Learning Skills Center for further assistance.

Your Speech Clinic **user name** is made up as follows:

- first two letters of first name,
- first two letters of last name,
- last five numbers of student ID,
- lab section number.

Your **password** is the month and day of your birth (four digits only).

For example, if your name is Fred Smith, and your student I.D. number is 88-123-4567, and your section number is 9999, then your user name would be **frsm345679999.** If you were born on January 12, then your password would be **0112**.

All characters should be lower-case, without any spaces or punctuation.

At the end of your session, click the "exit" icon near the bottom of the Start Bar at the right side of the screen.
